#### **Breakout: Quarterly vs. Monthly Meetings**

- **Discussion Summary:** Nedah gave a presentation on the Proposed Communication Plan. The Board could potentially move to quarterly meetings with Monthly Communications to the board from the CRM. The Executive Committee Agendas would be sent out to the entire Board. Those with interest can join those meetings. The confidential info (minimal impacts on the towns) will be able to be requested, rather than distributing it to all 100 board members. Other communications would be given as needed.
- Group 1: 4 towns agreed with going to quarterly, alot of the meeting is info giving. They like the give and take of the towns that happen during the meetings. We can revert after 2 quarters
- Group 2: generally comfortable. Expectation for more public communication. Moving to bi-monthly to maintain engagement.
- Group 3: 5 towns. Relieves the burden on the staff. Should work. Not into heavy construction, maybe we could have more meetings more often when it is busy (special meeting plan) a little bit of apprehension

- Group 4: eventually open to quarterly meetings, but feel it is sudden. Gradual change bi-monthly first. Need to maintain engagement and people coming to the meetings. The plan is comprehensive. Also incorporate relationships with media (driving the narrative)
- Group 5: Apprehension about sudden changes, monthly updates are preferred. Apprehension in the direction of communications (with a top down structure).
- **Discussion Summary**: we need to do more work and nail down the details before we move everyone around. Get communications out, working and functioning, and see how everyone feels about it next month (for a bi-monthly plan).
