Timelines

- 1. Simplify a complicated process for messaging
- 2. Publicly share build plans as funding is secured
- 3. Set community expectations as construction gets underway with OLT located, permitting & make ready mostly complete.
- 4. Seek firm customer commitments 90 days from the area being lit with 90% certainty.

End of the Line/ Off Grid

- 1. Our mission is universal service
- 2. Immediate need is to have consistent and fair criteria that staff can use for immediate decisions
- 3. We therefore recommend a policy specific to Phase I which clarifies how we will decide whether residences will be included in the phase I build.
- 4. We have a draft policy we are workshopping
- 5. Staff is working to collect and summarize data which might help with defining and executing the draft policy

## Seasonal

- 1. Short season vs. 1/2 year
  - a. Promote Value
  - b. Have customer centric POV
- 2. Costs to recoup:
  - a. Installation & Hardware
  - b. Partner fees

- 3. Create "suspended service" option rather than disconnect/reconnect
- 4. Many options for billing/service

## Affordability

- 1. Working with NEKCA and WCVT on ACP promotion
- 2. Following up with disconnected or late customers on whether they qualify
- 3. Pursuing philanthropic support
- 4. Considering income qualified pricing

## Underground

- 1. Approach state & federal legislators to provide funding for buried drops for low-income families
- 2. Pilot Discount: \$400 for paying up front
- 3. Pilot Installment Plan: 2-3 year payback period without interest?
- 4. Follow up with those not installing underground to take service will be conducted as part of the pilot.
- 5. Perform a Pilot review and provide analysis when Pilot ends.
