Role Call & Agenda Review

The posted agenda had our standard meeting zoom link and the calendar invite had a different link. A member of the public made us aware of that and everyone was moved from the calendar invite link to the publicly posted link.

Public Session Presentation on a Merger of NEK Broadband and CVFiber to Create Northeast Central Broadband

Discussion Summary: Executive Director, Christa Shute, noted that tonight's vote
is the first step in the merger process. She described the proposed Northeast
Central Broadband as a 71 town CUD committed to universal service to all the
underserved locations in our communities in the most efficient and cost-effective
way that will benefit our towns. Benefits of merging for both current CUDs include
cash flow, grant advantages and organizational efficiencies. Six working groups
have been involved in analyzing the potential merger - Governance, Legal,
Communications, Human Resources, Operations, and Finance.

NEK Broadband will continue to be the underlying legal entity because of the federal grants and loans that it has received and applied for which are hard to change. The merged CUD will operate under an assumed name of Northeast Central Broadband. Internal and external communications have been developed for the merger process to address the interests and concerns of each group of identified stakeholders. This includes a FAQ sheet. The transfer of the management of CVFiber's warehouse to NEK Broadband is permanent, regardless of the vote, because it replaces an expensive third party and allows for mutual efficiencies. The financial analysis so far has involved an in-depth review of the history of all the grants, a review of all the transactions of CVFiber, and a cash flow analysis. Assets and inventory items were evaluated as well as the comparison of budget to actuals.

The maps of both CUDs were then shown, which included the areas built as well as planned construction for this year. The merger will not slow down construction. The main delay of construction currently is the licensing process with local utilities, although NEK Broadband is still on target to hit 400 miles for the year. 133 miles have been built to date and another 250 miles are actively being worked on by three different construction companies. NEK Broadband also expects to provide service in portions of the ReConnect grant by the end of the year, specifically along portions of the former state-owned fiber, now owned or controlled by NEK Broadband. Miles built, passings, and current customers to date of the two CUDs were shown and compared. Highlighted was the parity in the number of customers, (a little over 300) even though NEK has built nearly double the miles. This is probably a combination of factors including NEKs drive to build the backbone first; CVFiber's higher population density and median incomes and CVFiber's branding efforts.

Once merged, the two Executive Committees will initially be merged and both brands will remain. After today's preliminary merger vote, there will be a public hearing on July 16, 2024, followed by final merger vote around August 15. Another meeting on July 11, 2024 will be held in which additional materials and analysis that have yet to be done will be discussed and voted on. The timeline is tight because of BEAD (Broadband Equity Access & Deployment) funding. The \$229 million for BEAD allocated to Vermont will be competitively distributed to those entities who commit to serving every unserved address in an entire district. The larger district will allow for a more competitive application. The merged CUD will have to be formed before the full BEAD proposal window starts, which is currently scheduled around Aug. 24.

If the merger goes through, the construction schedule, the ARPA grants, the current funding in the two areas, the town ARPA grants, the brands, the Executive and Finance Committees, and partners will not change. At the same time, the organization will expand to 71 towns, combine inventory, apply for BEAD, have access to the bond market faster (because of the doubling of customers), and combine administrative costs.

If the vote is affirmative today, an Executive Committee Charter working group will work on the Executive Committee structure to pare down the number of members to an odd number. Other working groups will address the Finance Committee charter, HR policies, culture and organization and the budget. In addition, the staff of the two organizations will start working together as one team starting June 3. Between now and early July, a primary task will be the development of a new business model with the help of JSI, a very experienced national consulting company, that will accommodate all the complexities we have in our current

situation and market. When it's ready, using the new business model will help answer the remaining analysis questions before Governing Board meetings to be scheduled for early July.
